We can expect warmer weather in April, which increases the rate of mosquito breeding. Therefore, we must be vigilant in ensuring that mosquito breeding and dengue infection are minimised during these warmer days.

In this issue, you can read about how our Town Council Property Officers and cleaners have been working closely with the National Environment Agency (NEA) to ensure that our common spaces are free of mosquito breeding.

Meanwhile, residents also play a very important role in the fight against dengue and mosquito breeding. By

practising the 5-step Mozzie Wipeout both inside and outside their homes, everyone can play their part in preventing mosquito breeding. We are grateful to residents who help to watch out for one another by draining stagnant water from the plates under plant pots for their neighbours or helping their neighbours clear clutter in the common areas.

Residents can also create a more pleasant living environment by working with our Town Council staff and cleaners to remove clutter in our common areas such as along corridors and at staircases, lift landings and void decks. It is crucial that such common areas remain



clutter-free to prevent fire hazards. Also, obstruction-free spaces allow fast evacuation during emergencies and allow people using mobility devices or walking aids to get around more easily.

Safety in our housing estates is a shared responsibility. Let us work together and keep a lookout for one another so that we can make our estates an even better home for all of us.



Left stacks of newspapers, unwanted furniture or laundry racks along the corridor outside your house? These could become fire hazards or obstruct common corridors during emergencies.

To prevent items like these from cluttering up corridors, staircases and landing areas, Ang Mo Kio Town Council carries out regular block inspections of common areas.

During the inspection, Town Council Property Officers who find obstructions outside residents' homes will advise them to clear away the items. Those who do not comply or are not at home will receive a written notice. A week later, follow-up checks will be conducted and if the clutter is still there, a final three-day notice would be served. Residents who still fail to take action may be fined up to \$1,000.

The Town Council will also remove items that obstruct or pose a fire hazard in common areas. Items not claimed after 30 days will be disposed of.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

- Do not use common corridors as a storage area especially for flammable items.
- According to the Singapore Civil Defence Force's guidelines, there should be a clear space of at least 1.2m wide along the corridor so that ambulance stretchers and wheelchairs can pass.
- → Keep staircases and landings clear at all times.
- → If you have any unwanted bulky items, call the Town Council at 6453 0511, who will help to dispose of them.

Raising funds while going green

When students from Ang Mo Kio Secondary School and Townsville Primary School took part in their schools' recycling drives, they did more than just help the environment. They also helped to raise funds for their schools.

On 29 January, 210 students from Ang Mo Kio Secondary School's Upper Secondary classes went to 28 blocks of flats near their school to collect items for their school's annual recycling drive.

Going tirelessly from house to house, the students collected items such as newspapers, old books, old clothes and small electrical appliances.

Similarly, 43 students from Townsville Primary School's Boys' and Girls' Brigade held their recycling drive on 4 February. Together, the students, aged 10 to 12, covered Blocks 403 and 405 next to their school, channeling the serving spirit exhorted by their uniformed group.

The items collected by each school were handed over to the Town Council's contractor, 800 Super Waste Management, which weighed the items and

then paid out money that went into the schools' funds for needy students.

Talk about a two-in-one good deed.

The eyes and ears on the ground

When an elderly lady lost her way, Mr Hanif Abu, 34, an Ang Mo Kio Town Council conservancy worker, stepped in to save the day.

The elderly lady was confused and couldn't tell police where she lived. But Mr Hanif had seen her around the Teck Ghee neighbourhood where he works and knew where she lived. Thanks to him, the lady was safely returned home.

Mr Hanif's keen eye was the result of a training session he attended, which taught observational skills to conservancy workers. This is so that the workers can help the police look out for criminal activities such as unlicensed moneylending or drug abuse.

The workers also learnt first aid skills and how to use a fire extinguisher. The training session was part of Project C.L.E.A.N, which aims to keep the community safe and secure.

Said Senior Station Inspector Muhamed Taha bin Abdul Karim: "Our conservancy workers can be our 'eyes and ears' on the ground as they go about maintaining our neighbourhoods."

Mr Hanif attended the session in January with 96 other workers. He said: "I'm now more alert to my surroundings, and I'm happy that I can help people."

His colleague, Mr Uddin Jashim, 30, added: "Now we know how to call the police and are not afraid to do so."

And of course, being able to help senior citizens who have lost their way is a definite bonus.

Safe Use of Lifts 安全使用电梯

DOs: 请:



Supervising adults should always accompany young children and ensure they do not place their hands on lift doors.

Do ensure that your leashed pet stays inside the lift as the doors close.

DON'Ts: 请勿:



Do not use any part of the body (e.g. hand/leg) to stop the doors from closing. Press the "Door Open" button instead. 请不要使用身体任何部位(如手脚)阻止电梯门关闭。请按"开门"按钮,将电梯门打开。



Do not try to pry open the lift doors when the lift stalls. Press the alarm button and wait for rescue.

Do not jump or play in the lift. This may cause the lift to stall.

请不要在电梯里跳动或玩耍。这可能导致电梯 停止操作



Do not stand near the lift doors. Small and thin objects like long skirts, leashes and backpack straps can get caught. 请不要站靠近电梯门边。细长的物品如长裙、宠物的绳索和背包带,可能被门夹住。



Keeping the roads safe

To keep both pedestrians and motorists safe, the Yio Chu Kang Grassroots Organisations has been working with the Land Transport Authority on improving the roads in the neighbourhood.

For example, along Lentor Avenue, "SLOW" markings have been added on the road before bus stops to encourage motorists to slow down. "PEDESTRIAN AHEAD" signs will also be installed near the bus stops.

Accountant Foo Sook Chong, who lives in The Lentor Residence, welcomes these changes. "Traffic is quite heavy here, and I'm glad there are measures to prevent accidents," said the 38-year-old.

There are also plans to create traffic islands

opposite bus stops so people crossing the road have a safe area to stand while waiting for traffic to clear.

Residents also requested for a convex mirror at Countryside Road between house unit numbers 139 and 141, where the bend in the road creates a blind corner. When told that the mirror has been installed, Thomas Lin, 42, applauds the prompt action. He said: "It is good that concerns on the ground are heard and dealt with quickly."





Keeping dengue at bay

Recently, the number of dengue cases in Singapore has increased sharply, and Ang Mo Kio Town Council has stepped up efforts to keep its residents safe.

For one, its contractors are making sure that drains in the estate are cleared of debris and litter and cracked drains repaired, while pest controllers conduct thorough checks in the estate, applying oil to potential mosquito breeding spots.

The Town Council is also working closely with the National Environment Agency (NEA) to educate its conservancy workers on how to prevent mosquito breeding. The workers are taught how to identify Aedes mosquitoes and inspect potential mosquito breeding sites as part of their daily routine.

Said conservancy worker Shahidul, 27: "I find the NEA workshop very beneficial, as I can apply this knowledge at home too."

Students from Anderson Secondary School have also been roped in to reach out to households in Cheng San-Seletar, distributing informational leaflets to residents and showing them how to prevent mosquitoes from breeding in their homes.

How you can prevent mosquitoes from breeding in your home

- Change the water in vases/bowls on alternate days
- Turn over all water storage containers and check that their rims are dry
- Remove water from the plates under flower pots on alternate days
- Cover bamboo pole holders when not in use
- Clear blockages and put BTI insecticide in roof gutters monthly

增强防范措施 打击骨痛热症

我国近期的骨痛热症病例显著增加,宏茂桥市镇理事会加强应对措施,避免更多居民受感染。这其中包括促请承包商清理沟渠的垃圾和维修破裂的沟渠,以及雇用灭虫专家在住宅区进行彻底检查,喷洒杀虫剂,消除潜在的蚊虫滋生地。

市镇理事会也跟国家环境局密切合作,教导清洁工如何做好防蚊措施,包括辨别伊蚊,以及在日常工作中时刻检查潜在的蚊虫滋生地。清洁工沙西杜尔(Shahidul, 27岁)说: "国家环境局的工作坊很实用,我也可以把学到的知识用于家中。"

安德逊中学的学生也受邀参加市镇理事会的防蚊计划,帮忙在静山一实里达一带分发宣传单,并为居民讲解在家中预防蚊虫滋生的方法。

டெங்கியால் பாதிக்கப்படுவோர் எண்ணிக்கை அண்மையில் சிங்கப்பூரில் வெகுவாக அதிகரித்துள்ளது. இந்நிலையில் குடியிருப்பாளர்களைப் பாதுகாப்பாக வைத்திருக்க அங் மோ கியோ நகர மன்றம் அதன் முயற்சிகளை முடுக்கி விட்டிருக்கிறது.

எடுத்துக்காட்டாக, பேட்டையில் உள்ள சாக்கடைகளில் கிடக்கும் குப்பைக்கூளங்கள் அகற்றப்படுவதையும் சாக்கடைகளில் உள்ள வெடிப்புகள் பழுதுபார்க்கப்படுவதையும் நகர மன்றக் குத்தகையாளர்கள் உறுதிப்படுத்துகிறார்கள். அதே சமயத்தில், பூச்சித்தடுப்பு கட்டுப்பாட்டாளர்கள் பேட்டை முழுவதும் விரிவாகச் சோதனை செய்து, கொசு இனப்பெருக்கம் செய்யக்கூடிய இடங்களில் எண்ணெய் விடுகிறார்கள்.

கொசு இனப்பெருக்கம் செய்வதை எப்படி தடுப்பதென்று பராமரிப்புத் தொழிலாளர்களுக்குக் கற்றுத்தர தேசிய சுற்றுப்புற வாரியத்துடனும் (NEA) நகர மன்றம் அணுக்கமாகச் செயல்படுகிறது. அன்றாடப் பணிகளின் ஒரு பகுதியாக ஏடிஸ் கொசுக்களை அடையாளம் காணவும், கொசு இனப்பெருக்கம் செய்யக்கூடிய இடங்களைக் கண்காணிக்கவும் தொழிலாளர்களுக்குக் கற்றுத் தரப்படுகிறது.

பராமாப்புத் தொழிலாளரான 27 வயது ஒஹிதுல், "NEA பயிலரங்கு மிகவும் பயனுள்ளதாக இருந்தது. இங்கு கற்றுக்கொண்டதை நான் வீட்டிலும் பயன்படுத்தலாம்," என்று கூறினார்.

Are you aware of new dengue rules?

From March 14, a home owner will be fined \$200 if mosquitoes are found breeding on the premises regardless of whether the house is in a dengue cluster. This is because most cases of mosquito breeding take place in the home.

Private estates fight dengue too

Residents in private estates are not left out in the fight against dengue.

Grassroots leaders, together with officers from the National Environment Agency (NEA), conduct house visits in private estates and distribute informational leaflets to residents. Roadshows and educational booths are also set up during Neighbourhood Committee events so that residents can learn about the dengue situation

and their role in the national fight against the virus.

Said IT manager Calvin Teoh, 43, who lives in Jalan Keruing: "Most people don't realise the seriousness of dengue until it hits them, so every effort to increase awareness helps."

Warmer weather due to the El Nino phenomenon means the number of dengue cases may continue to increase.

However, residents such as 67-year-old Susan Chua are confident that everyone will stay vigilant in the fight against dengue. She said: "With the help of the Town Council and NEA, we can all do our part to protect our loved ones."

Many of you may be aware of the presence of the Zika virus in countries like Brazil and South Korea. Here, *Our Home* highlights five key facts you need to know about this health threat:

What are the symptoms?

The symptoms are usually mild and last between two and seven days, and are similar to other mosquito-borne diseases such as dengue: fever, rashes, conjunctivitis, muscle and joint pain, malaise and headache.

What is Zika?

It is a disease caused by a virus transmitted by the Aedes mosquito.

Is there a cure?

There is no cure so far. Scientists are currently studying how to produce vaccines, but it could take five to seven years before one is commercially available.

How can you protect yourself?

If you're travelling to countries affected by Zika, wear covered clothing and apply insect repellent. At home, take precautions to prevent mosquito breeding.

What can you do if you are infected?

Doctors advise those who are infected to get plenty of rest and drink lots of fluids, while pain and fever are treated with available medicines.




